

IMPACT: *Going Above and Beyond*

To say these last three years have been a challenge, would be an understatement. There have been many difficult and challenging situations to address...and I want to share with you how Cancer Action has risen to meet these challenges and made sure cancer patients in our community receive the services and support they need. I would first like to share gratitude to the board of directors and staff for keeping our organization strong and responsive.

When the pandemic began, Cancer Action immediately pivoted, working with our healthcare providers, to help clients get services without coming to the office. Cancer

Action offices remained open, utilizing a revised schedule, to help people get supplies they need, throughout the pandemic. We reduced our overhead expenses to ensure every dollar possible would go toward the needs of cancer patients, “keeping the main thing, the main thing!”

We were even able to expand services to respond to some of the unmet needs and gaps in care. Beginning in 2022, we expanded our service delivery to include Cass County and added a Gas Card Assistance Program to help with the additional gas expenses during the time of treatment. We expanded the medical equipment we purchase to meet some of the needs for clients experiencing weakness and difficulty getting around. These have been beneficial programs for many cancer patients in our community

Some unexpected challenges arose toward the end of last year when there was a national shortage of the nutritional

supplement given to our clients. Our vendor was unable to get the products we needed to provide our Boost program. This is the most highly utilized program for our agency, helping hundred of cancer patients each year. One of our longtime partners that helps provide this vital program is the Kansas City Medicine Cabinet.

We collaborated to work through the supply chain issues. Cancer Action was able to order the nutritional supplement directly and then our staff made home deliveries to ensure clients got the nutritional support critical during their time of treatment. We were also able to

partner with another local non-profit, Accessibility Medical Equipment, which became a direct supplier and was able to provide home shipments to our clients. While this was an extremely challenging situation, the collaboration resolved the crisis and our clients did not miss getting the nutritional support needed to maintain their weight and energy during their cancer treatment.

These are just a few ways Cancer Action has been ***Going Above and Beyond*** to ensure cancer patients in our community have had their needs met during this historical and challenging time. We are so grateful to our donors, our healthcare partners and our community partners like the Kansas City Medicine Cabinet, for helping keep Cancer Action strong and accessible through every step of the cancer journey for hundreds of cancer patients in our community.

McCurry's

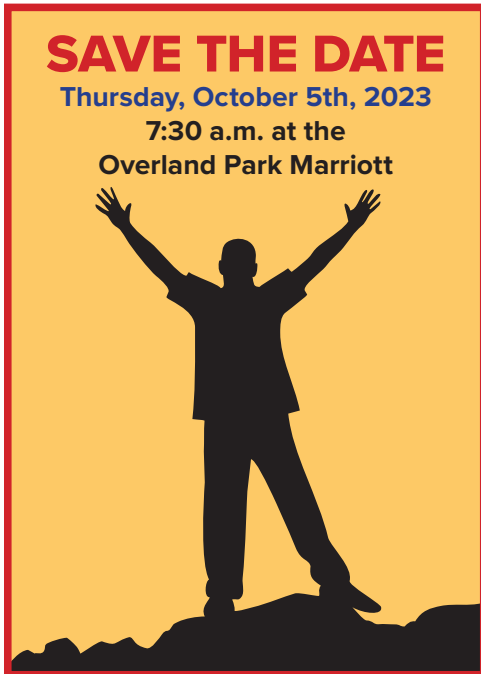

One Client's Story...

My name is April. I am a 52-year old, mother of six. I first became aware of Cancer Action in 2016 when I was looking for a wig. I had been diagnosed with breast cancer, had already had surgery and was receiving chemotherapy. At that time, I was only able to receive donated items as I lived in Cass County, which was not a county they provided financial assistance. I received a wig, mastectomy supplies, a few medical supplies and donated Boost. They also provided mastectomy supplies for me in 2018, 2019 and 2021.

My cancer returned in 2022 and had spread to other areas in my body. When I contacted Cancer Action, I discovered they had added Cass County to their approved counties for financial assistance. I have received Boost Glucose Control, medical supplies, a wheelchair, and most importantly a gas card. I live in rural Cass County with no surrounding cancer facilities. With gas prices as they are now, the gas card has been a great help. Cancer Action has impacted me in many ways through the years. I am thankful for all their support!
